My Brothers & Sisters in Christ,

As the Council prepares to embark on a planning process this month, I asked our Administrative Assistant, Claudia Steele, for her perspective on our ministry. As a member of a non-Lutheran congregation, and a past secretary in an Episcopal parish, she has a unique view of our congregation. Her response surprised and touch me in a very nice way. I thought you should hear it, so this month you have a guest author for the Pastor's letter.



Why I came and why I stay Your Passion for the Mission and Ministry of the Church

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ:

I am coming up on my 5th year anniversary of serving at Shepherd of the Hills Evangelical Lutheran Church. It has been a wonderful 5 years and I am looking forward to many more. I changed jobs because I wanted (and needed) to be involved with a church that put mission and ministry of the church in the forefront. Yes, the church needs to pay the bills but the personal faith development and outreach to the community is what should drive the organization. I am struck by your can-do attitude when selecting the projects that you commit to.

Yes, I do mean serving. When I take on a "job" it is because it is also a ministry to me. My work as the Administrative Assistant at Shepherd of the Hills fills that desire well. I am here to support your Pastor, the other paid staff and the unpaid staff (that is you!). For without that unpaid staff there would be no church. And what a job you do! I see it on a weekly basis. I see the piles of items grow and grow and grow and then suddenly they are gone. Then a few weeks later a thank you note comes from one of the many agencies that you support.

This summer is not an exception. Some think that the church is slow during the summer. While it might not have the hub bub of the program year, there is and was activity. During the program year, WOW! What a mighty work you do!

This is what I see:

- I see the food pantry box has been filled and emptied numerous times, not just during the holiday season. Your faithfulness to address the needs of hunger is greatly appreciated.
- I see the Community Garden for our elderly neighbors has been planted, tended, and harvested by a variety of people who just seem to come and go with barely a trail left behind.
- I see the support for the Youth Mission Trips that many in other churches would envy. You support this energetic group through the church's budget, through your donations for the various fundraisers, through your generosity of love offerings even when you don't have young people involved. And most importantly through your prayers during their trip.
- I see the special collections throughout the year: School supplies, Operation Christmas Child shoeboxes, Easter baskets, Thanksgiving baskets, the Warming Tree. During November and December, you really out do yourselves each year.

- I see the Prayer Shawls that are lovingly made and then shared far and wide. Each year, you and others make enough of these shawls to send with your youth to minister to those they minister to during their mission trips.
- I see the sign-up sheets for helping others through Habitat for Humanity or Thrivent Builds and there are about 20 names on it! That is about 5% of the people of that worship here on a weekly basis. Can you imagine what it would be like if all of the churches were able to have 5% of their congregations to do community service projects? (See elsewhere in the newsletter for the next opportunity.)
- I see a building that is shared with others in the community. There are home schoolers several days a week during the school year. There is a dog training classes. As well as opening our facilities to AA and the Granby Food Co-op. And now, there is another growing church within these walls.
- I see the support that you give your Pastor and Linda in the Lutheran Marriage Encounter ministry for which they have such passion. It would be hard for me to put into words what it means to me that you support the need for a clergy couple to present Marriage Encounter weekends and to fund the staffing that requires for Sunday worship.
- I see a prayer list that reflects the far reach that each of us has. I see a prayer list that is open to requesters of all ages.
- I see a music program that is growing. Since I have started here, you have added a First Service choir, a contemporary music ensemble and a hand chime choir. You have also provided an opportunity for the youth (and those young at heart) to participate in a contemporary music ensemble.
- I see the leadership that put faith first. The Council agenda begins with faith building and ends with prayer. In between is the business of the church.
- I work with a pastor that is passionate about God's Word and how it applies to our daily lives. I am honored to work with Pastor McGurn, as he helps me to grow in living out my faith through the work that I have been given here at Shepherd of the Hills. He also ministers in such a manner as to help his "sheep" to interpret their world through the scriptures.
- I see a community of believers that is intentional about the worship on Sunday mornings. There are many hours that are spent on selecting the many components to the service (hymns, service music, scriptures and prayers); drafting, proofing and producing the weekly bulletin. The Worship Planning Team is detail oriented and works very hard to provide a bulletin that would be easy to use, especially for those that may be visiting.

Again, I salute you for all that you do. Continue to explore and grow in the Great Commission.

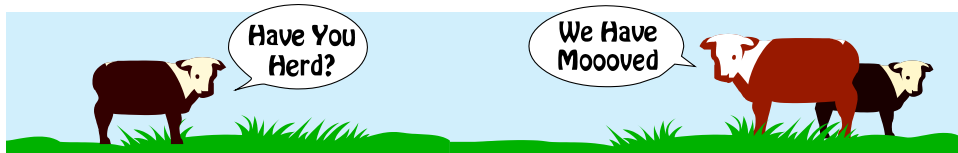

Building on Faith

Building on Faith is an annual week-long celebration of church partnerships and a worldwide sermon of God's love. During this week, local Habitat affiliates and their church partners host building events and celebrations.

Sunday School Resumes
